Sophia College, MDSU Sign MoU for Collaboration

AJMER, 7 JAN

In a major move to strengthen higher education, teacher training, and academic collaboration, Maharshi Dayanand Saraswati University (MDSU) and Sophia College (Autonomous), Ajmer, signed a significant Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the UGC-Malaviya Mission Teacher Training Centre (MMTTC). This agreement aims to foster academic cooperation, research, and capacity-building initiatives, providing a new direction for joint educational efforts.

Prof. Suresh Kumar Agrawal, Vice-Chancellor of MDSU, highlighted that the primary goal of the MoU is to enhance academic quality through collaborative

The partnership will focus on philosophy of education, the Indian education system, management studies, and personality development, while also promoting awareness of the interconnection between society, environment, development, and education.

Under this MoU, UGC-MMTTC will concentrate on continuous professional development for teachers, innovation in teaching practices, blended learning, and outcome-based ed-

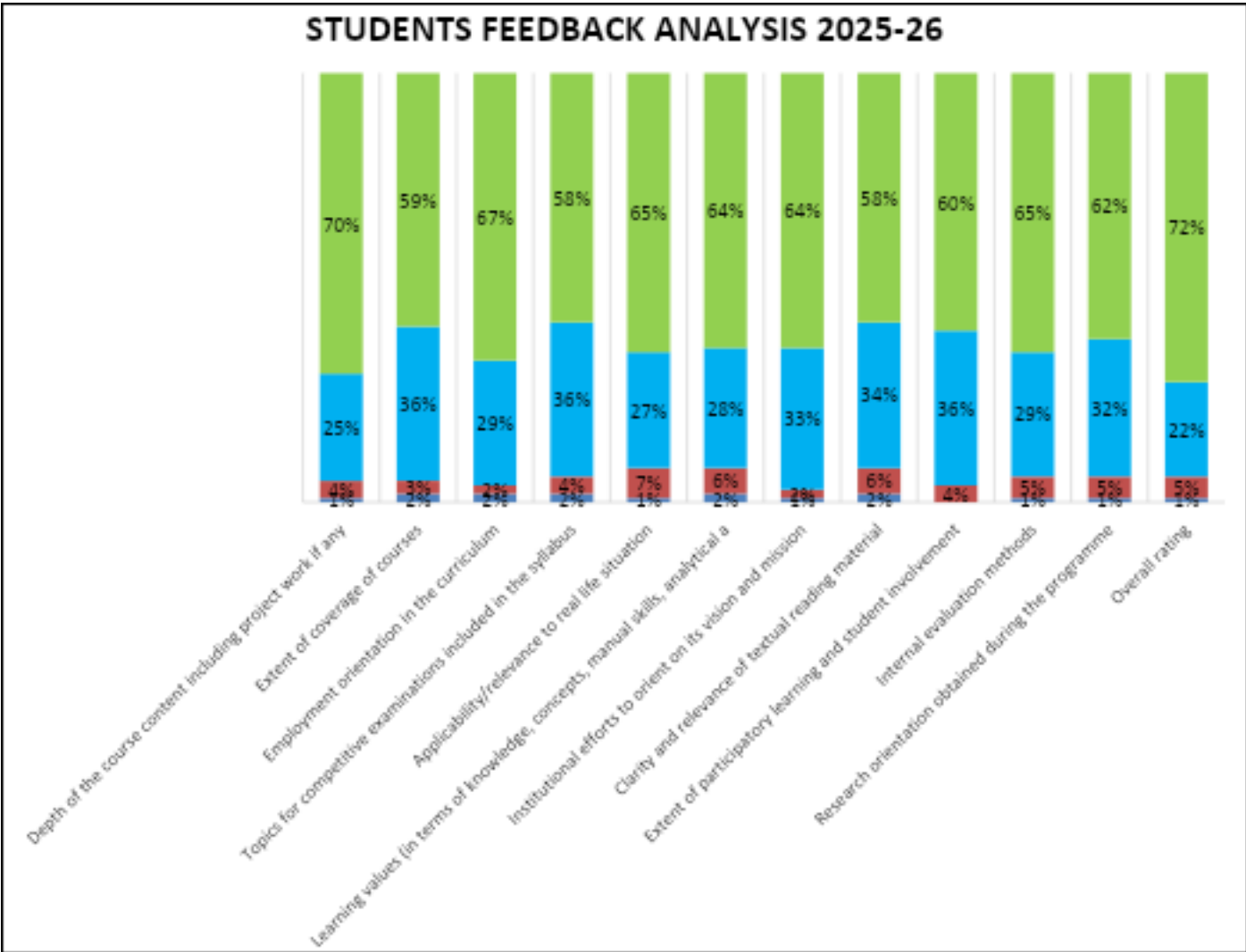

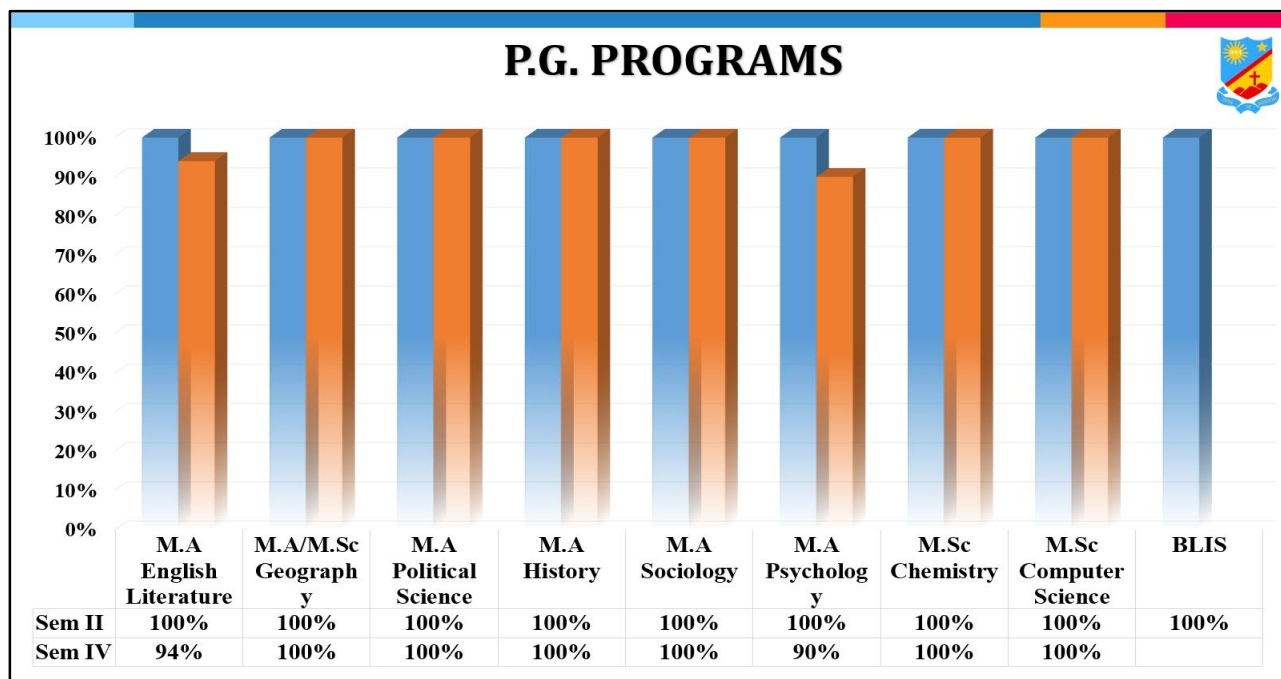
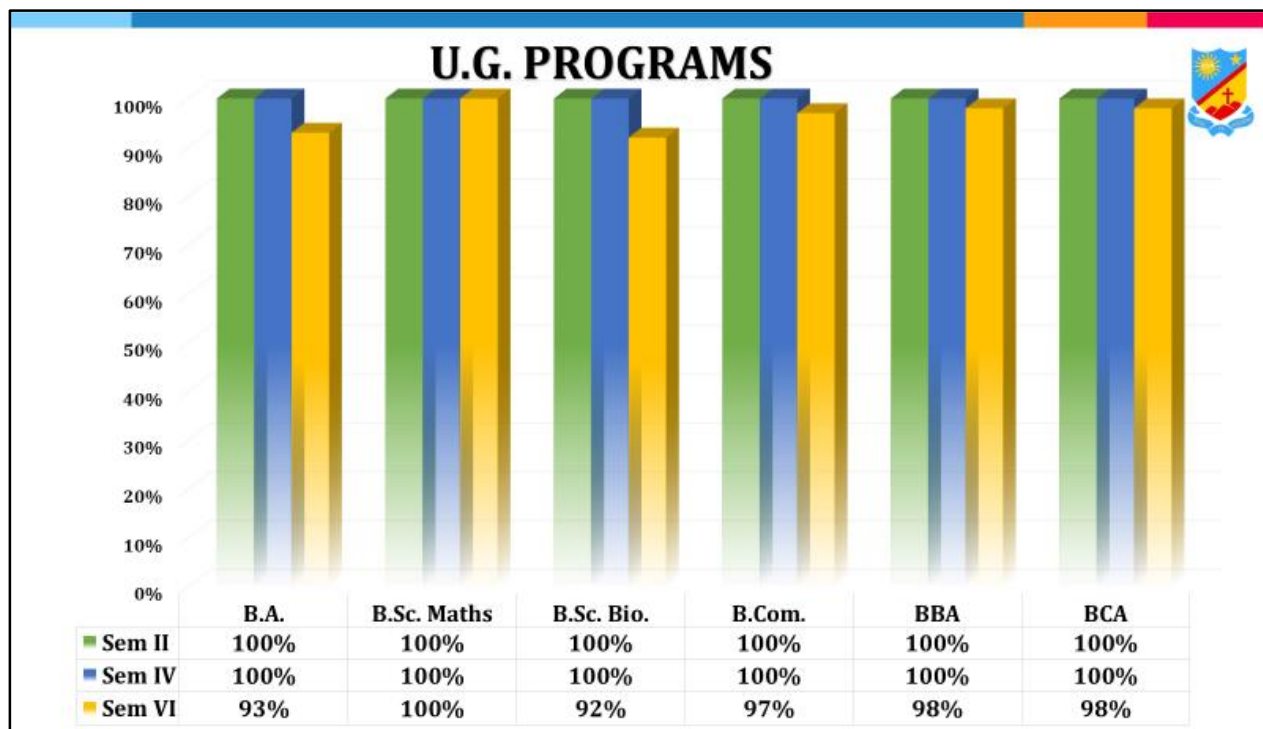

XVIII. PLACEMENT

The Training and Placement Cell was actively engaged in organizing various academic and professional development activities during the session 2025–26 with the objective of enhancing students' employability and preparing them for successful careers. Companies and organizations like Deutsche Bank, Qspiders, Xebia India Pvt. Ltd., Satguru Pvt. Ltd., Travelykke & Facto participated in the Placement Drives conducted by The Training and Placement Cell. 8 students got placed in Deutsche Bank, 3 students got placed in Xebia India Pvt. Ltd., 11 students got placed in Qspiders, 6 students got placed in Satguru Pvt. Ltd., 2 students got placed in Travelykke, 2 students got placed in Facto, 1 student was selected in Mayo College, Ajmer, Pravah, an organization working in the social development sector, selected 1 student for the role of Associate Consultant, Cyntexa also provided opportunities to 1 student, 3 students were selected in Travelykke and 3 students were placed in CollegeSathi. These placements reflect the diverse opportunities provided across sectors such as banking, IT, consulting, education, and startups. The overall placement performance demonstrates the effectiveness of the Training and Placement Cell in connecting students with industry and preparing them for professional roles.

intellectual creations. The session was conducted by Dr. Sudarshan S. Bobade, an experienced academician and IPR expert.

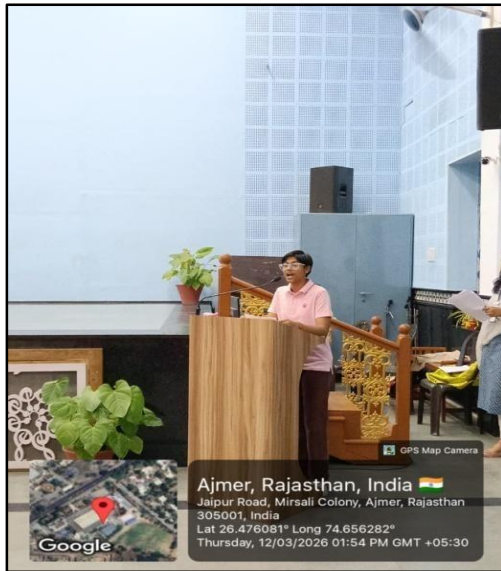

NATURE CLUB

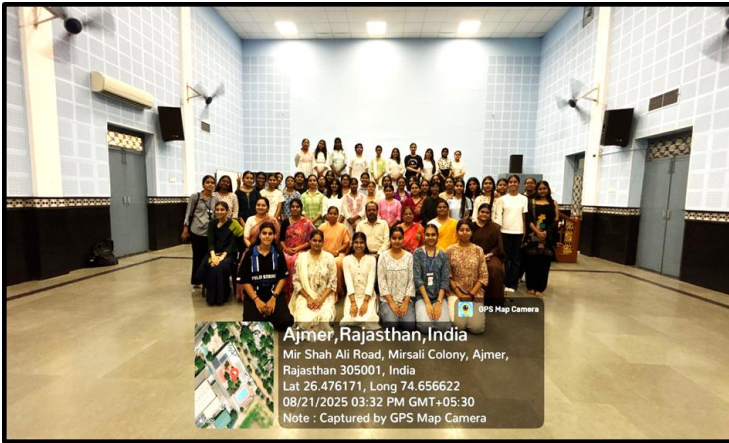

ORCHID & FLORICANS – THE BOTANY & ZOOLOGY FORUM

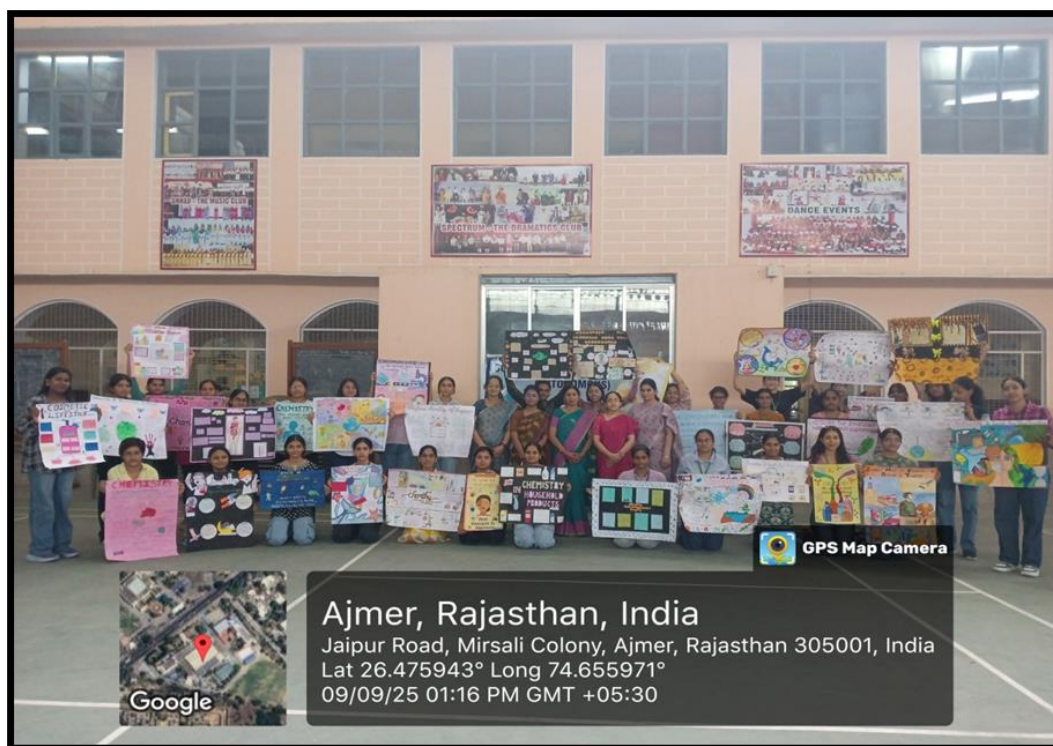

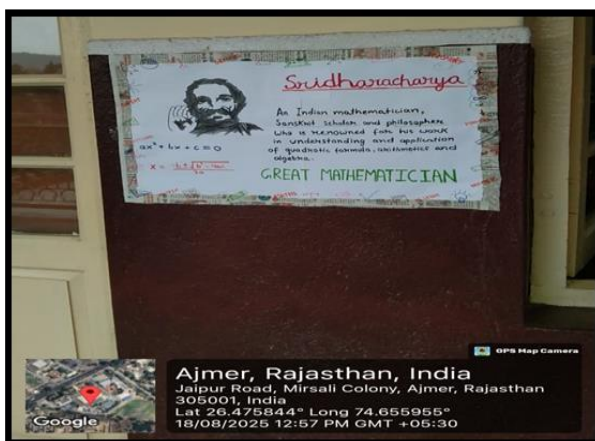
- A session on “Empowering Futures through Global Learning” was organized on 15th July. 50 students attended. The session highlighted global education trends and international career opportunities.

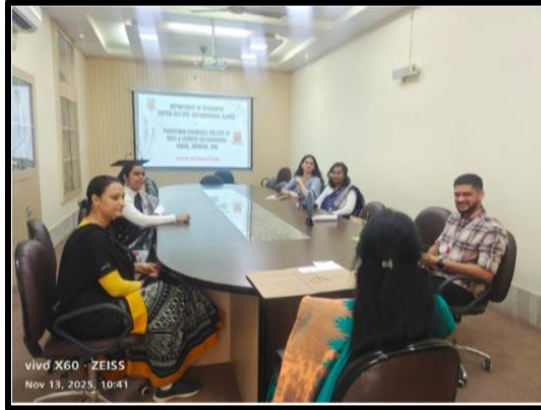

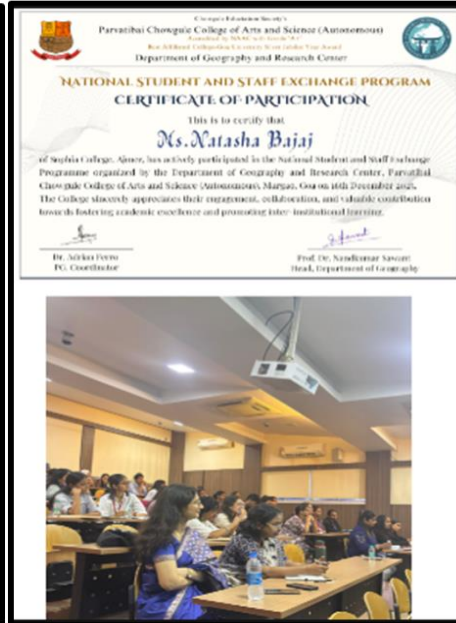
