Name of Activity: Seminar on “US-Iran Tensions in Context to India's Stance”.

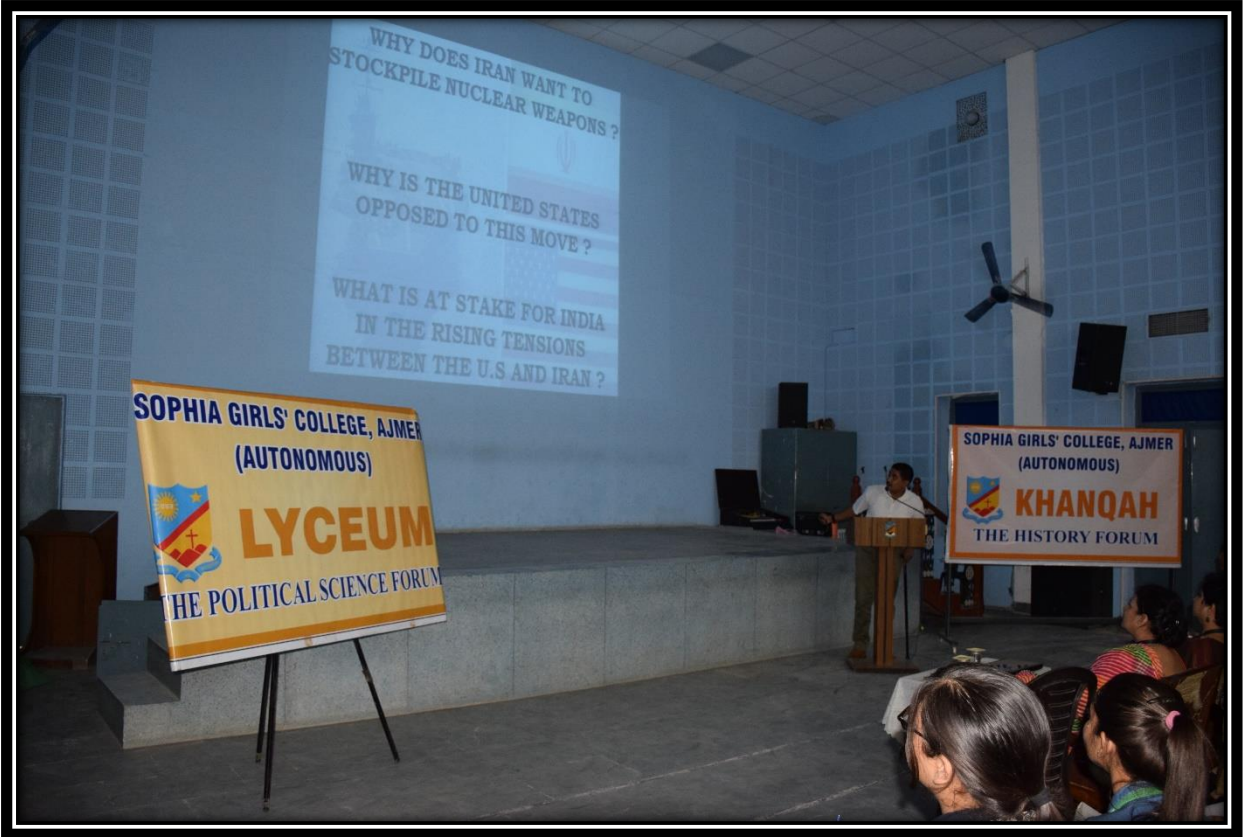

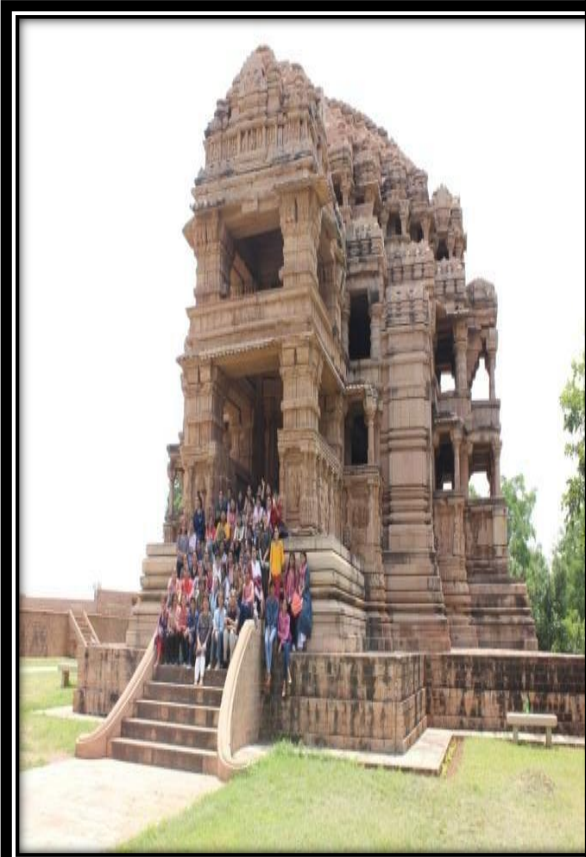

Outcome of Activity: The trip was to connect the students the heritage and history of Madhya Pradesh which has been one of the most strategical location in the history of Indian sub-continent.



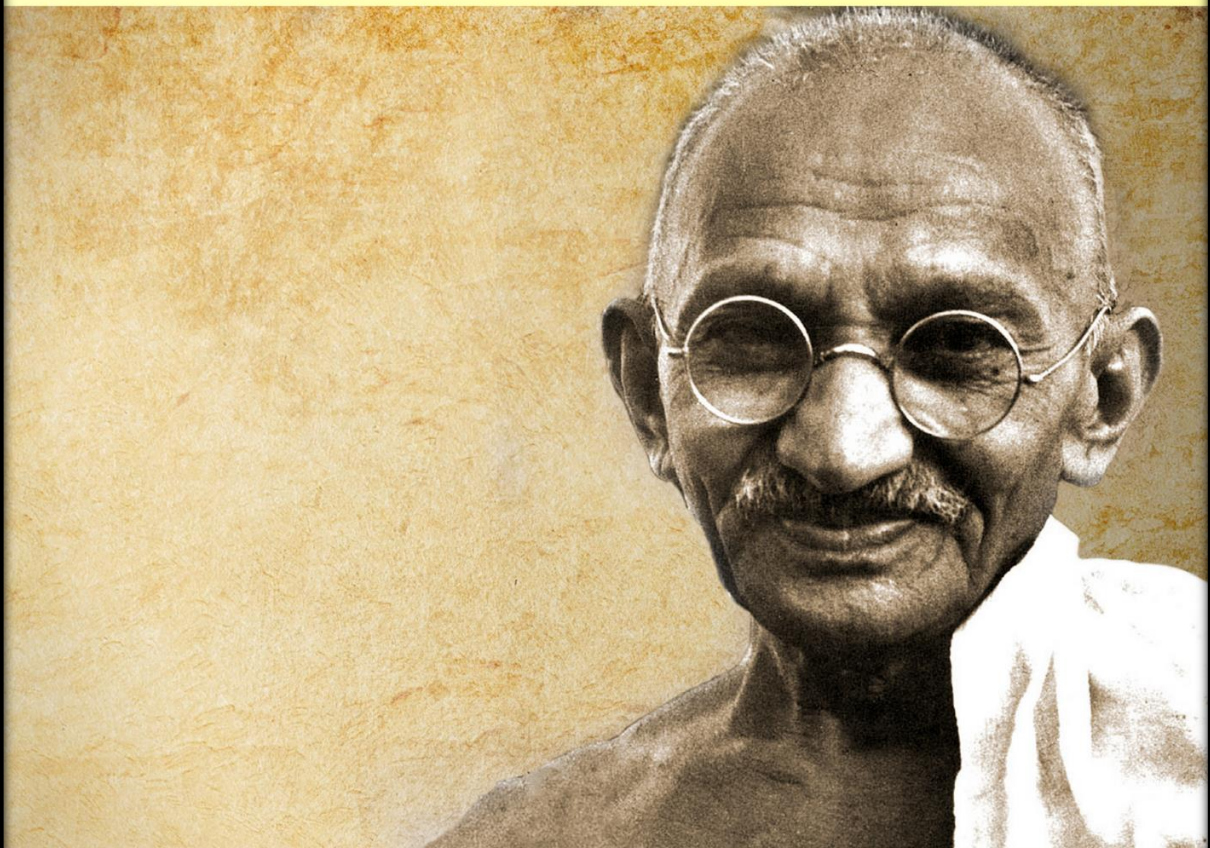


3. Trip to Jaipur for conference on Gandhian Discourse in Humanities and Social Sciences (NCGDHSS-2019).

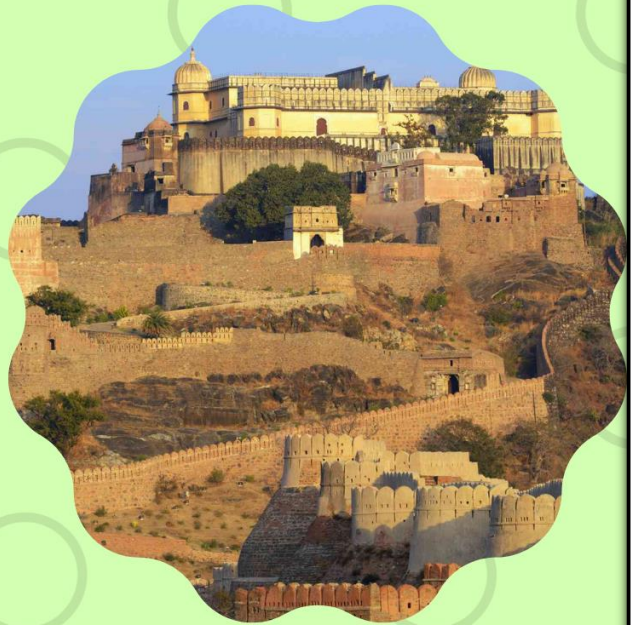


6. Educational Tour to Kumbhalgarh-Ranakpur
